Dear Parishioners-

We come to the end of the liturgical Year with the Feast of Christ the King. It seems appropriate that many of the events from the Gospel of Luke culminate on Calvary, where Jesus died on the cross for our sins. It is also a reminder that in the midst of many kings that vie for our attention-power, pleasure, wealth, honor, or even the Caesers that rule over our lives, we have but one King whose reign lasts forever, He is Jesus Christ, the Lord and King. Pope Pius XI thought that it would be appropriate to institute this Feast to counteract the secularism and atheism of his time back in 1925. It is even more appropriate today as secularism and atheism reigns even more in our time and day. We might even believe there is indifference to the faith, which in a sense, is even worse. After being quite full, some of us would find a bedroom and sleep it off or take a walk (as I often did with my cousin, Gloria). These were joyful memories of Thanksgivings in the past. These are blessings that I have cherished and not taken for granted. My hope is that you will truly have a joyous time this upcoming holiday. I have to say it is my favorite holiday.
