PASTOR REPORT

Dear Parishioners-

This week we celebrate two Marian Feasts. The first is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. It is normally a holy day of obligation. This year, since the date has been moved to the 9th (The Second Sunday of Advent takes precedence over any Marian and Saint Feast Day), it is not a Holy Day. The celebration of this Feast actually dates back to the Seventh Century. Some theologians contended that Mary could have only been sinless if she was exempt from original sin, while others contended that she could only have been redeemed if she was subject to original sin. The Church has stated from the fifteenth century that she was conceived without original sin and remained without sin throughout her entire life. This doctrine was formally defined by Pope Pius IX-(Ineffabilis Deus, December 8th, 1854), 'Mary, in the first instance of her conception by a singular privilege and grace granted by God in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, Savior of the Human Race was preserved free from all stain of original sin.' She remained without sin by cooperating and fully responding to God's Grace throughout her life. We find evidence of this in Scripture through the Early Church Father's reflection upon Genesis 3:15 and Luke 1:28. The next feast is celebrated Thursday December 12-The Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. St. Juan Diego, a sixteenth century, simple faithful layman, was walking to church one Saturday morning, December 9,1531 when Our Lady appeared to him and asked him to ask the Bishop to build a chapel on Tepeyac Hill. St. Juan Diego was sidetracked for a good reason. He desired to tend to a sick Uncle, whom the blessed Mother assured would get well. He followed through on her request to the Bishop who was guite skeptical of the vision. Then, Juan brought roses that came to bloom in the middle of Winter, a miracle in itself, yet, even a greater miracle happened, for in his tilma was the image of Our Lady. The Bishop believed and had a chapel built. It was recorded that nine million in Mexico converted to Christianity. This Feast is celebrated by the Mexican culture annually. (Source-Franciscan Media)

These two feasts are the only times during Advent where the Gloria is recited or sung.

Let us remember the Blessed Virgin Mary in a special way this week through these two significant feasts and consider attending Mass in her honor.




