PASTOR REPORT

Dear Parishioners:

My hope is that many of you are listening in or viewing the livestreaming/streaming Masses, announcements/ communications, prayers over the last weeks. These are unchartered territories for most of us. It is really important that we stay close to Jesus during these difficult times. We need to converse and listen with our hearts. We need to share what is really going on inside with us with Him, but also make sure we are staying in touch with friends (physical presence with social distancing, phone, facetime, e-mail, texts, etc.). God never meant for us to carry our burdens alone.

I was reflecting on our readings today. Ezekiel speaks about dry bones but that new life will come from the time of their exile. It is a message of hope to a people in a foreign land, foreign culture during the 6th century B.C. Some of them would have been born in Babylon and some died there with 50 plus years of exile. Can you imagine 50 years? That is a long time. They needed the prophet's word to bring hope, healing, and consolation such as Ezekiel and Isaiah, who at times, could be tough on the people and their sins. Then, we see Jesus coming along the scene to Martha, Mary, and Lazarus. Lazarus was terminally ill, ready to die. Jesus took off. Didn't he care? Why would he do such a thing at their hour of need? Then, he dies. He has been dead for four days. Jews would believe the soul left the body after 3 days. Jesus would demonstrate that he was unlike any others. He would raise Lazarus from the dead. Lazarus, COME OUT! In their great moment of despair and sadness, Jesus brings hope and new life. He wants to do the same for us in this challenging time of global history. He wants to bring hope to us, as we encounter, social distancing. spiritual sacrifice from Holy Communion, and for some of us, being forced to work out of our homes or others of us, finding ourselves unemployed due to company cutbacks or other challenging situations. God wants to bring hope and new life to us as he did to the Jews in exile, to Mary and Martha, and to us today.

Blessings and peace on this Passiontide Sunday!
