PASTORS REPORT

Dear Parishioners:

We celebrate Gaudete Sunday this weekend. Gaudete means rejoice from the Latin. The Scripture verse we take this from is: Philippians 4:4-5: "Rejoice in the Lord always, again I Say, Rejoice, Indeed, the Lord is near." The church sees this penitential season of Advent as more than half way over and we look forward to the annual celebration of Christmas, but also look back to that first Christmas, when he came in history to the people of his time and day, yet also, in majesty, when he comes again in glory. Our hearts long for his coming when His people rejoice to see him returning to his people and bringing them to the new, eternal Jerusalem. Let us look at the setting for the first reading. Israel had been in Babylonian exile for nearly 50 years. They were in a foreign land with foreign customs and traditions. It might be like us being deported to another part of the world, where our faith, language, food, culture, customs, traditions, etc. would all be a foreign concept. It might take some getting used to and more than likely, we would never completely adjust, particularly when it came to our faith in Jesus, if that was subordinated to the State or some other ideology that was not a part of the Democratic Republic process which allowed freedom to worship or to celebrate holidays or if done so, more or less in a hidden, underground way, much like the Christians lived in the first centuries with the Masses in catacombs. Persecution, even death may be part of the exile. Then, Isaiah, the prophet tells them, they will return home to all their familiar faith, customs, traditions, language, food, and culture. This would be a cause for rejoicing. Yes, there would be a rebuilding process, yet, God would not abandon them.

Then, we look at the Gospel reading for today, St. John the Baptist is in jail. He has spoke the truth to the powers to be. They wanted nothing of that and nothing to do with him. In fact, he would soon lose his head, literally, as a martyr under King Herod. He had called Herod and Herodius out due to the adulterous affair. He was not into making friends and influencing people as Dale Carnegie might say. Even today, a modern day St. John the Baptist, might find himself or herself in the same predicament. St. John the Baptist might have been in the 'dumps', Is this Messiah whom we have had fever pitch expectations not going to overthrow the oppressive Rome? Is he not an earthly king? St. John the Baptist was told the same message from Isaiah: the blind would see, the deaf would hear, the mute would speak, those in captivity would be liberated or freed, the poor would have the Good News preached to them, etc. This is Good News, this is cause for rejoicing. Jesus Christ is not some earthly king who is here today, gone tomorrow, or ruling for two, four, six, eight or even 20 or 30 years, but a king whose reign is forever, a king who would establish peace, justice, righteousness for all peoples from the womb to the tomb. He needs us. We are his hands, eyes, ears, and feet here on this earth. We are called to make a difference, to make known his Joy, by being a people of joy, a people who rejoice! Someone said JOY is Jesus, Others, and Yourself. When we put things in this priority, we will have true JOY in our lives. . So, Rejoice in the Lord always, again, I say, rejoice,. Indeed, the Lord is near. Philipians 4:4-5. Happy Gaudete Sunday! Fr. Chris
