PASTORS REPORT

Dear Parishioners:

We celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family this weekend! Although the Coptic faith tradition has celebrated this feast in earliest times due to the flight into Egypt, the Feast of the Holy Family is fairly recent in its origin. According to one source, Barbara d'Hillehoust founded the Association of the Holy Family in Montreal in 1663. The devotion spread and in 1893, Pope Leo XIII, approved the Feast and himself composed part of the Office. It was welcomed by succeeding pontiffs in trying to bring home the model of the Holy Family in trying to stem the evils of modern society. It was not until the time of Pope Benedict XVI (Cardinal Francis della Chiesa) to insert the Feast into the Liturgical Calendar in 1921. Originally, it was the Sunday after Epiphany (which is now the Baptism of the Lord), but it was moved to the Sunday after Christmas only in 1969, bringing within it the Christmas Season.

(source:www.brittanica.com & www.salvemariaregina.com) I can remember as a young boy romanticizing this Feast. As I have had time to pray and study some of the outside sources, I realize that what they went through was anything but a cakewalk. I believe that they had little understanding of what their Yes to God and the angel would entail. They would leave behind Anna, Joachim, and their relatives to travel by foot to Bethlehem to register for the census under Caesar Augustus. Then, they dealt with fear of the Christ child being snatched out of their hands by Herod's soldiers as many young boys were giving their lives for the Messiah by being killed by Herod and his men. This was a great systemic corruption in the political atmosphere at the time, not unlike today with the holocaust of abortion and injustice on so many levels. Then, they had to make the flight into Egypt. They dealt with: fear of gentile robbers, animals of prey, horrid weather conditions, lack of food or shelter, and so forth. Once they arrived in Egypt, they would be dealing with homesickness away from family, a new culture, language, and way of life with the trade of carpentry which may have been much different in Israel. For two years, they lived there. Then, they had to leave behind acquaintances and friends they met in Egypt and begin to make their way back home, starting over again with the new clients, etc. The Holy Family had their share of crosses and frustrations, but bore them patiently for God and His Son. If that was not enough, they were both present at Golgotha in body and spirit, to watch their Son die on the cross for the salvation of the world. As Deacon Dave O'Brien mentioned last weekend, it was their Yes' that made it possible for His 'Yes' on the Cross and for our salvation.

Like the Holy Family, we are called to sanctity too. It involves prayer-making Christ central in our lives, study of our church teachings, reaching out to the poor as the Holy Family did with their resources, communication, and spending quality time with our family. There are so many obstacles that can get in the way, particularly with allowing ourselves to cave in to the busy-ness of our lives or allowing ourselves to accommodate to the culture, that we too easily blend in and make little difference in our world. Money, honor, power, pleasure, just 'getting along' or 'letting be' can be just some of things that can keep us from becoming who we were meant to be. We, as a family of faith, are called to make a difference by what we say and do in a culture that has given over itself to the lies of the evil one. Let us look to the example of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, on this Feast of the Holy Family who sought out to please God more than anything else in their lives. Happy Feast of the Holy Family! Fr. Chris


