From the Desk of the Director of Religious Education at St. Thomas Aquinas

Here we are again in Ordinary Time in the church's liturgical year. But for the Lord, nothing is "ordinary." The priest wears green vestments to represent new spiritual growth after the Christmas season. Jesus opens this new season with the Call of the Disciples to follow Him.

In this weekend's Gospel, the disciples are interested in getting to know more about Jesus and where he stays. Jesus turns to them and invites them to follow him. The invitation to follow Jesus was not simply given to a group of men 2000 years ago. The Scripture is alive today and Jesus asks each one of us to follow Him.

Jesus's invitation to the disciples to follow him was so momentous to them that the Gospel writer notes the exact time of day that they heard Jesus say, "Come." They remember the minute their life changed.

What might Jesus be calling you to do at this time in your life? Even in a pandemic, there are things you can do to strengthen your relationship with God and follow Jesus more closely.

You could join our parish prayer chain and offer up prayers for people who need our support.

Other prayer opportunities: Monday evenings – Rosary and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament at Immaculate Conception. Tuesday evenings – Mass, followed by the Rosary at St. Thomas Aquinas.

We also have times available for one-hour Adoration in our perpetual Adoration Chapel.

Twice a month on the first and third Mondays, our church sponsors The Gathering Table, a free evening meal (take-out only at this time). And we need people to sign up to provide food and to prepare the take -out packages.

On the first five Sundays in Lent from 7 pm-8:15 pm, beginning Feb. 17, we will offer a WATCH retreat from the comfort of your own home with guest speakers, prayers and insights into saints' lives.

There are also other liturgical opportunities – ushers, lectors, Eucharistic ministers, musicians.

This is a new year, Christ is inviting us to encounter Him. Pray about how you can offer your gifts to God and like Samuel in Sunday's first reading, we can say, "Here I am, Lord.".
