#### PASTORS REPORT

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Someone may ask you, why you do that; or you yourself may wonder why we do that. Lent is fast approaching, in fact it begins this week and I will share some of the Church's history and faith traditions about Lent.

Ash Wednesday comes from the ancient Jewish tradition of penance and fasting. The practice includes the wearing of ashes on the head. The ashes symbolize the dust from which God made us. As the priest applies ashes to a person's forehead, he speaks the words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

This year due to COVID-19 ashes will be sprinkled on your head instead of placed on your forehead. The distribution of ashes comes from a ceremony of ages past. Christians who had committed grave fault performed public penance. On Ash Wednesday, the bishop blessed the hair shirts, which they wore during the forty days of penance, by sprinkling ashes, made from palms of the previous year. The penitents did not enter the church again until Maundy (Holy) Thursday after having won reconciliation by the toil of forty days' penance and sacramental absolution. (Catholic Online.org/clife/lent/ahwed.php)

The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy of Vatican Council II states there are two important elements of Lent; recalling baptism or the preparation of it and penance in preparing the faithful to celebrate Easter. The word origin of "lent" comes from the Anglo-Saxon word "lencten" meaning "Spring" and "lenctentid" the word for March; for which most of lent is in.

There is evidence of Lenten practices in the early church. With the legalization of Christianity in A.D. 313, lent became a regular practice emphasizing the 40-days of fasting.

Why 40 days? It has a spiritual importance; Moses spent 40 days and 40 nights on Mount Sinai fasting (no food or water) in preparation to receive the Ten Commandments; Elijah walked 40 days and nights to the mountain of the Lord, Mount Horeb; and Jesus fasted and prayed for 40 days and 40 nights in the desert before he started his public ministry.

Once 40 days of lent was determined there was debate as to what consisted of 40 days; finally the practice of fasting six days a week excluding Sundays for six weeks and Ash Wednesday would constitute the number of fast days to forty before Easter.

The rules for fasting varied, some required abstinence from meat or things that come from flesh including eggs, milk and cheese. Others made exception for fish. This led to the blessing of Easter eggs and eating pancakes on Shrove Tuesday (from "to shrive" or hear confessions) or Mardi gras (French word translated to English is Fat Tuesday) the day before Ash Wednesday. Mardi gras is thought to be a hedonistic event; however its roots lie in the Christian calendar as the last hurrah before Lent begins.

The other rule was one meal a day in the evening or 3:00 PM. For some of us, we remember fasting from midnight to Sunday morning in order to receive the

Blessed Sacrament when we went to Mass. And we didn't eat meat on any Friday.

Today we abstain from meat on Fridays in Lent, fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday and give something up for the Lord. Over time Lenten practices are simpler and easy. Father William Saunders stated he was taught, "If you gave something up for the Lord, tough it out. Don't act like a Pharisee looking for a loophole." Although, Lenten practices have changed over time, the purpose is the same, repent our sins and renew our faith.

The past twelve months has had its challenges, sacrifices made, loved ones lost and injustices. I suppose we could have a pity party; however remember Jesus had challenges, experienced injustices, sacrifices, and had a horrible, terrific and very painful death. Why? For who? For US and our sins!

This Lent I urge everyone to reflect on their life experiences of the last twelve months and consider spiritual works like attending the Stations of the Cross, doing a weekly holy hour before the Blessed Sacrament (St. Thomas has an Adoration Chapel), attend Mass, and go to reconciliation or pray the rosary or attend rosary (Immaculate Conception on Monday evenings or St. Thomas on Tuesday evenings), and participate in the Virtual Watch Retreat.
