PASTORS REPORT

Dear Parishioners:

We celebrate Passiontide Sunday, the Fifth Sunday of Lent. Jesus is warning his followers that his time is about to come to an end. He will make that trip to Calvary, carry his cross some six hundred yards from the place of his arrest, and be nailed to it. We, as followers, are called to walk in his footsteps by denying ourselves and taking up our crosses and we will find life. I don't know about you, when I am walking from station to station each Friday and come upon the 12th station where Jesus dies on the cross, the thought of nails going into my palms, through my feet, and a sword at my side, does not sound very appealing. On top of it, there is no pain killers. Throughout much of the world, particularly in the Middle East and China (even Buddhists, Muslims, or meditation group such as the Falun Gong and those proclaiming to be Christian can expect cruel tortues, whether it be a harvesting of organs while alive or beheading). This is the truth! Most of us, will not experience crosses of those kinds, but we might experience alienation from family, friends, or others for speaking out and living out our faith. Yet, some are being, 'cancelled' today, just for exercising their freedom of speech. Where this will lead, who knows!

This is also the week where the Church gives us the opportunity to veil the sacred images and statues. According to Catholic Culture.org, The actual covering of images came later, perhaps continuing that theme of "fasting of the eyes." According to Adolf Adam's *The Liturgical Year*,

At the end of the thirteenth century Bishop William Durandus of Mende (Southern France) explains this custom by the fact that Christ veiled his divinity during his passion. Durandus saw this explanation as implied in this Sunday's gospel (from pre-Vatican II), the concluding sentence of which read: "But Jesus hid himself and left the temple" (John 8:59). Prior to Vatican II the editors of the Schott Missal saw the veiling of crosses and so on as intended "to remind us of the Redeemer's humiliation and thus to imprint the image of the crucified Christ more deeply on our hearts." The rubrics in *The Third Edition of the Roman Missal* states.

In the Dioceses of the United States, the practice of covering crosses and images throughout the church from this Sunday may be observed. Crosses remain covered until the end of the Celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, but images remain covered until the beginning of the Easter Vigil (Fifth Sunday of Lent, p. 256).

According to Monsignor Peter J. Elliott:

The custom of veiling crosses and images in these last two weeks of Lent has much to commend it in terms of religious psychology, because it helps us to concentrate on the great essentials of Christ's work of Redemption. The episcopal conference decides whether this should be obligatory within its territory, but any pastor may choose to restore or maintain this wise practice in his own parish (*Ceremonies of the Liturgical Year*). Feed the Hungry--Helping Hand Collection


