PASTORS REPORT

Dear Parishioners:

We would like to thank the Miller, Thomas, and Peterson families' memorial benches just outside of the east entrance/exits of the church! During these late spring, summer, and early fall months, my hope is that you will use them as you pray, wait for relatives and friends, or enjoy a little reading out in the warm sunshine days. Once again, thank you, your gifts are most appreciated!

Thank you to the Jauron family for the beautiful State Street Maple Tree on the south grounds of our church! It is most appreciated!

This weekend, we celebrate the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity-three persons in one God. It is a Feast celebrated inside of Ordinary Time. Many people have tried to explain this great mystery of faith with either a shamrock as St. Patrick did to the people of Ireland-three leaf clover on one stem (unless one was fortunate enough to locate a four leaf clover) or others through the use of the Sun with its rays and heat, the Sun being God, the Father, the sun sending out its rays, being God the Son, the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity, then from both the sun and its rays, from the Father and the Son, proceeds the Holy Spirit, the heat. I am sure there are other objects or analogies that have been used to explain the Trinity, without getting into heresy or false teaching. Now, this Feast originated in the 10th Century, gradually spreading into the churches of Northern Europe. It was Pope John XXII who approved this Feast for the entire church in 1334. Other faith traditions celebrate this Feast, including the Anglican, Lutheran, and Orthodox traditions.

I would like to focus on the pastoral side along with the history and theological side. One way to look at this feast is that it is the mystery of love in the community of three persons in one God, all with their various functions (yet, not limited to function, of course) with the Creator, the Redeemer, and Sanctifier (baptisms will be invalid if using this formula) as it does not take into account ontology or being. This perfect love of the Trinity of persons invites us to work toward a more ideal love of a community of faith to draw others into the faith through our gifts. prayer, fasting, modeling our lives in the community of love of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. This side of heaven, we will never achieve this ideal goal, yet, we should never tire of trying to reach this goal. In our households, organizations we belong to, committees we are a part of, and our own faith community, let us pray and work toward the model of love that the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit demonstrate to us. 
