PASTORS REPORT

Dear Parishioners:

Also, to our Knights of Columbus who have prepared the pulled pork and all the fixings and drinks! Another great thanks to Greg Brangers for the use of his golf cart to transport those with special needs from the parking lot to the tents. Your help in making this a spiritual success was most appreciated!

We come to the last in the series from the Bread of Life Discourses from John 6. The crowds are still murmuring at Jesus call to eat his flesh and drink his blood. They have had enough of him. Who does he think he is for us to eat his flesh and drink his blood. Then, in John 6:66 (complete imperfection or as some might say, the mark of the beast), they leave and refuse to follow Jesus anymore. He lost a number of disciples that day. Was he discouraged or was he tempted to scale back or sugar coat or water down his message so that they would not leave? I am sure he was, but thankfully, he did not. He let them go their own way. Some might say, 'boy, this Jesus is real rigid!' Jesus was not going to back down the teaching of HIS REAL PRESENCE. Neither should we. In the previous passage, he used the word, 'sarx' or 'trogo' which meant to 'munch' or 'gnaw.' He literally calls us to eat His body and blood. This was what got the early Christians in hot water with the emperors or the worldly authorities in the first three centuries of the Church. Christians were sent to the lions, used as human torches, or crucified or suffered others forms of torture to preserve the belief in the Real Presence of Jesus. We might be very called to do that in today's world as some still find this teaching disgusting or too much and readily leave his fold. Jesus invites us to stay with him or gives us the freedom to leave him. Like, St. Peter, we are invited to fidelity, even though we might not fully comprehend this teaching by stating, Lord, where shall we go, you have the words of everlasting life." Let's continually ask for the grace to follow Jesus, even when when science and reason make no sense to, yet faith does.


