#### PASTORS REPORT

#### Dear Parishioners:

We have two significant days in the church's calendar this week. First, there is All Saints and second, All Souls Day! It is believed that All Saints Feast Day arose after the legalization of Christianity under Emperor Constantine in 313 A.D. Many had died as martyrs under the Emperor Diocletian (284-305 A.D.). There was a call to honor them as there were more martyrs or those who would be recognized as saints then there were days in the year.

Various times were celebrated to honor the saints in the East, particularly during the Easter Season and shortly thereafter. In the West, it was usually the first Sunday after Pentecost (which is now, Holy Trinity Sunday). Pope Gregory III (731-741 A.D.) dedicated an oratory in the original St. Peter's Basilica in honor of all the saints on November 1. According to an early church historian, John Beleth (1165 A.D.), it was Pope Gregory IV (827-844 A.D.) who officially declared November 1 as the Feast of All Saints, transferring it from May 13. We know there are a variety of saints with a variety of personalities. We have St. Phillip Neri, who laughed and was quite light-hearted to the serious St. Jerome, who translated the scriptures from Greek and Hebrew into the Latin Vulgate. We have intellectuals such as St. Thomas Aquinas (our patron saint) to St. John Vianney, the patron saint of parish priests who labored hard in the French town of Ars as a confessor and barely made it through the seminary. We have St. Vincent de Paul who worked hard for the poor in the city, while St. Anthony found holiness in the desert. We have St. Joan of Arc, who led armies into war and St. Francis of Assisi, who worked for peace. Then, there are you and I who have a variety and diversity of gifts and are called to holiness in life in a variety of ways.

It is a time to honor the Church Triumphant who cheer and encourage us as fans on the sidelines while we are on the playing field (Church Militant), fighting the spiritual battles with the Sword of the Holy Spirit armored in Scripture, the Sacraments, and prayer. Let us honor them in a special way this Monday, November 1 by attending Mass either at 7:00 a.m. at St. Thomas Aquinas or at 7 p.m. at Immaculate Conception.

Second, All Souls Day is a day for commemoration of all the faithful departed. It is believed to be for those baptized Christians in purgatory. They would have died with venial sins (The First Letter of John speaks of 'not so deadly' sins before one died), yet are in need of purification as Revelation 21:27 states, 'nothing unclean shall enter heaven.' Requiem Masses are commonly held and people visit the graves of the loved ones on this Spiritual Memorial Day. The institution for this day was due to St. Odilo of Cluny (Abbot of Cluny who died in 1048 AD). The date of November 2 was chosen to follow All Saints Day. (source: dailyrosaryfamily.com, October 23, 2018 by Vincent).

#### PASTORS REPORT cont.

Prayers for the Dead were a part of the Orthodox Jewish tradition. The Talmud states that prayers for the dead will help to bring greater rewards and blessings to them. There is also the Mourner's Kaddish in which prayers are recited for eleven months after the death of a loved one so that he or she may be purified. Jesus and the apostles shared this belief and passed it to the early Church -- "Remember us who have gone before you, in your prayers," is a petition often found inscribed on the walls of Roman Catacombs. The early church included 'Prayers for the Dead.' The early Fathers of the Church encouraged this practice as well. Tertullian (160-240 A.D.) wrote about the anniversary Masses for the dead, advising widows to pray for their husbands. The synods of Nicaea, Florence, and Trent encouraged the offerings of prayers for the dead. In the Old Testament, Judas Maccabees, the military commander, took up a collection from all his men, totaling about four pounds of silver and sent it to Jerusalem for a sin offering for those who died in battle wearing amulets sacred to idols that the sin would be blotted out (2 Maccabees 12:43). St. Paul in his letter to the Corinthians speaks about being 'saved as through fire.' (I Cor 3:11-15). The Catechism of the Catholic Church (#1032) recommends prayers for the dead in conjunction with the offering of the Eucharistic Sacrifice. (Fr. Tony Kadavil, All Souls).

Last, this coming Sunday, November 7, we will remember in a special way, those who have died with the Candle Lighting Service at 8:00 Mass at Immaculate Conception and 10:15 a.m. at St. Thomas Aquinas. The Medicare Part D open enrollment runs from October 15-December 7. It is important to do a comparison every year. You don't have to change plans if you don't want to, but plans can change premiums, deductibles, co-payments, the drugs they cover and the pharmacies they work with every year. If you don't stay on top of these changes you could end up paying more than you need to for your drugs in 2022.


