PASTORS REPORT

Dear Parishioners:

Saturday March 19, 2022 is the Solemnity of St. Joseph. It is a day we can truly celebrate the life of this man who lived an exemplary and holy life. Scriptures do not tell us much about him, other than he was a righteous man unwilling to expose the pregnant Virgin Mary to the law, which she could have been stoned to death. Rather, he was willing to divorce her quietly during that time of betrothal which was a little more than an engagement but not quite a marriage. During the time of betrothal, the future bride would still live with her parents rather than her future husband. Joseph and his pregnant wife, the Blessed Mother Mary, made the long journey to Bethlehem for the census in unpredictable weather. The birth of the child came about with little fanfare as it happened in a cave among animals. We believe the three wisemen or kings came from afar, that is the East, to bring gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. After a time, they were told in a dream to leave for Egypt, a long arduous journey that was filled with danger, that is, with Gentile robbers, predators, inclement weather, and little food. The boy child, Jesus, could potentially be snatched by the soldiers as happened to so many young boys when their mothers or fathers were carrying them in their arms. During that time, Joseph would have had to have the Blessed Mother hold in her arms, the child Jesus in the cave for his protection while he was out getting provisions for the family. After two years of experiencing the challenges of new culture in Egypt, they returned back to Nazareth to make their permanent home.

We can surmise that he was an honest carpenter, making his living supporting the Blessed Mother and his Divine Son, Jesus Christ. More than likely, he had scrupulous customers who paid him for a job well done. Yet, there were others who were less than scrupulous who gave him little for the stellar craftsmanship he put into his work. Jesus would have spent hours in Joseph's workshop learning how to make tables, chairs, or other items of the day. He would have been obedient to Joseph, who would kiss the ground Jesus would have walked on.

It can be easy to glamorize or romanticize the life of St. Joseph. St. Joseph was not immune from the crosses and trials of life. Even though tradition would have stated that he died before Jesus' public ministry, it is also believed that he was present in spirit at Golgotha, the place of His Son, Jesus' cross. We honor Joseph for his integrity, his obedience to God, even though he did not have all the details given to him in the dreams, and his life of chastity with the Blessed Mother Mary. I would like to invite you to a Mass this Saturday morning, March 19th, 9:00 a.m. at St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Church to celebrate the foster father of Jesus, St. Joseph! I hope to see you there!
