PASTORS REPORT

Dear Parishioners:

This coming Friday, March 25th is the Solemnity of the Annunciation. The Angel Gabriel visited the Blessed Mother Mary at the young age of 16 to announce the special mission from God to give birth to Jesus Christ. Now, can you imagine the news to an unwed mother about to give birth in nine months (some sources believe this was the actual date of Jesus' death). She had taken a vow of virginity at a young age in the temple where she was educated in the ways of the Jewish faith. Imagine the confusion in her mind of how all this would happen. The trust it took in carrying this call to fruition. Yes, the angel told her she would conceive by the Holy Spirit and that St. Joseph (whom she was betrothed (more than an engagement but not quite a marriage) to would be the foster father, would be her spouse. This would be a virgin birth and marriage. She said, Yes, and for that, we are eternally grateful, literally speaking. This feast dates back to the 4th or 5th century. It was first mentioned in the Canons of the Council of Toledo and Constantinople (modern day Istanbul). In 656 A.D. it was to have been celebrated throughout the church in Toledo. This feast is celebrated every year except when it falls during the Paschal Triduum. We find coverage of this Annunciation in Luke 1: 26-38 and in the first joyful mystery of the rosary. Mary's trust was exemplary, even though she did not know all the details, "may it be done to me according to thy word."

Some facts about the Annunciation. First of all, it happened in Italy, the house where Mary grew up and where she received the annunciation is currently in Loreto, Italy, Second, the name, 'Jesus' was given to Mary's promised son following the Angel Gabriel's instructions to her. Third, She is the Eternal Virgin-she remained a virgin throughout her life in spite of being married to Joseph. Fourth, The early church chose March 25th as the day for the Solemnity of the Annunciation because they believed that people died on the same day they were conceived, and they believed that this was the day Jesus died. Fifth, the artist Leonardo da Vinci was one of many artists who painted the Annunciation.

This Feast represents a day of hope for restoration of the broken relationship between God and us. It is divine as it celebrates His divinity and one of the greatest miracles in Christian history. This feast also unites Catholic Christians around the world celebrating this Solemnity and reciting the Hail Mary. We can celebrate this Solemnity by wearing white, reciting a Hail Mary, praying for all pregnant women and all the unborn children that they would receive the gift of life. (source: National Today)

I would also like to say, it is a day in which we are dispensed from the abstinence of meat. Yes, you can eat meat on this Friday during Lent because it is Solemnity and because the Church permits it. According to Canon 1251-Abstinence from eating meat or some other food according to the precepts of the conference of bishops is to be observed on every Friday of the year UNLESS A FRIDAY OCCURS ON A DAY LISTED AS A SOLEMNITY. Abstinence and fasting, however, are to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Folks, we will not see this happen for another 5 years (Solemnity of St. Joseph will fall on a Friday in 2027). Please take advantage of this dispensation!
