#### PASTORS REPORT

Dear Parishioners:

We celebrate the Feast of the Ascension. This feast speaks about Christ completing the work of our redemption forty days after his resurrection from the dead.. Although there is no documented evidence of this feast prior to the fifth century, St. Augustine, fourth and fifth century church father, spoke of its observance long before his time. We see this feast mentioned in the writings of St. John Chrysostum, St. Gregory of Nyssa, and the Constitution of the Apostles. In the Eastern Church, this feast was known as analepsis or the taking up and also as episozomene, the salvation, meaning that by ascending into His glory, Christ completed the work of our redemption. In the West, ascensio signify that Christ was raised up by HIs own powers. Tradition designates Mount Olivet near Bethany as the place where Christ left the earth. This feast falls on a Thursday, yet has been moved to Sunday in recent years. Some of the eastern United States archdioceses and dioceses and the Archdiocese of Omaha still retain Thursday or Ascension Thursday as many of us who grew up had known this feast. We might ask: What are the ramifications for the Feast of the Ascension or what does it all entail?

Good question. First, Jesus tells us that it is good for Him to leave in order to send the Holy Spirit, who will guide us back to God. Second, Jesus promised us he would not leave us orphans and he does not by sending us the Spirit, who is all present and in the Eucharist. He is particularly and substantially present in the Eucharist. (St. Pope Paul VI, Mysterium Fidei)

Third, the Ascension is not the end but the beginning. We have no 'Mission Accomplished' celebration when the Son of God took his well deserved vacation. His work was just beginning as he continually intercedes us, pleads for us, and shows His Father HIs still-open wounds.

Last, the good news of the Ascension is that heaven is now open to us. It was closed after the Fall, yet when the Son of Man returned to His father, He brought with Him His entire humanity. It is likely he brought many souls he rescued from the abode of the dead on Good Friday. St. Chrysostum, a fourth century bishop once wrote: Through the mystery of the Ascension we, who seemed unworthy of God's earth are taken up into Heaven...Our very nature, against which Cherubim guarded the gates of earthly paradise, is enthroned today high above all Cherubim." (source: The Meaning and Customs of Ascension Thursday, Michael P. Foley, May 25, 2022, The New Liturgical Movement). One final thought: The Feast of the Ascension reminds us to get busy going about proclaiming the Good News of Salvation. First, it is a call to prayer to test the spirits in order to discover where God is leading us to use our gifts to share the Good News. Then, to put the gifts into action so that God can use us to make a difference for the better in a world that needs His light of Goodness. It might mean standing up for life in a culture of death, it might mean bringing clarity to confusion, particularly on the whole gender ideology, it might mean reaching out to the poor, marginalized, and neglected in a world that is indifferent, and to be good stewards of our creation in a wasteful culture. Happy Feast of the Ascension!
