is here from now through February 14th thanks to Iowa Catholic Radio. The Vatican approved International Exhibit was Designed and created by Blessed Carlo Acutis.

Carlo, an artist, cartoonist and avid computer enthusiast created the art for the panels before his death from leukemia at age 15. The banners will be displayed throughout the building to increase awareness of the Real Presence of our Lord in the Eucharist and promote Eucharistic Adoration.

#### What is a Eucharistic Miracle?

Eucharistic miracles consist of unexplainable phenomena occurring after transubstantiation, such as a host visibly transforming into human tissue, a host surviving fire, a host bleeding or the Eucharist alone providing sustenance to a human being for a prolonged period of time.

In order to be considered a Eucharistic miracle, the event is investigated by a special task force before deciding it is worthy of belief. Secular sources are often used to investigate and confirm the miracle. Belief is approved miracles is not mandated by the Catholic Church by can reassure believers of God's presence in our world.

Reducing air travel can dramatically reduce your household carbon emissions. Air travel accounts for 12% of all U.S. transportation greenhouse gas emissions that warm the planet. Driving may be a better environmental option on shorter trips. Driving higher mileage cars with additional passengers is almost always a better environmental option. Reducing the number of flights you take is the most effective way of cutting your aviation footprint. If you have to fly, non-stop coach flights are typically the best alternative. Reducing the amount of stuff you take, and avoiding flights on very small or very large planes can also reduce your emissions impact. 




