

Saint Scholastica 480-543



Patron Saint of Nuns, twin sister to St. Benedict of Nursia. St. Scholastica was dedicated to God from a very young age. She established the first convent of Benedictine Nuns. A fun story recounts that after one of the brother and sister's yearly visits, Scholastica didn't want Benedict to leave, but when she asked him to prolong his stay he refused. Scholastica then closed her hands in prayer, after which a storm broke out, preventing Benedict from returning to his own abbey. She told him "You would not listen, so I asked my God and He did listen".

Creation Care

Scientists are now discovering microplastics and nanoplastics in our organs and arteries. Studies are ongoing as to how this will affect us. As consumers of plastics, we can make some changes in our lives to lessen the threat to our bodies. Here are just a few suggestions:

- Stop using bottled water. Replace plastic bottles with a reusable bottle.
- Consider investing in a filter for tap water.
- Eliminate single-use plastic as much as you can and don't reuse these items.
- Cut back on foods that come in plastic packaging or that have plastic linings.
- Aim for shorter dishwasher cycles with fewer plastic items.
- Never cook your food in plastic in the microwave. The heat will
 drive those particles into your food. Heat your leftovers on the
 stove.
- Stop using tea bags. Certain bags are loaded with microplastics. Replace them with loose leaf tea.
- Keep tires filled. Lower tire pressures can disperse microplastics into the air.

Social Concerns


Save the Date: "We Do Not Stand Alone"






