Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS)

Important beginning "works" in the atrium are called "practical life exercises". Even though many of the materials/items we have in the atrium *look* like toys and are enjoyed at such a level that it feels like play to the child, we always call them "works" because to work is to give a human being dignity. In <u>On Human Work</u>, [Laborem Exercens], no. 9), St. John Paul II states:"Work is a good thing for man-a good thing for his humanity-because through work man not only transforms nature, adapting it to his own needs, but he also achieves fulfillment as a human being and indeed, in a sense, becomes 'more a human being'."

These exercise help with the development/refinement of fine motor skills, self-control, and patience, which lead to the ability for contemplation. Every work a child does orients them towards life in the church. Pouring water readies them to prepare the cruets that are needed in mass for the priest to begin the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Folding cloths aids in laying out the altar cloth or using the purificator (the cloth used to wipe the cup during communion), or even unfolding the pall to cover the casket of a loved one before the funeral mass.



Here a child works in deep concentration, transferring water with a dropper from one vessel to another. This develops the "pincer grasp", which is crucial to prewriting skills, as well as hand-eye coordination, which is linked to cognitive development. This 3 year old did this work for 20 minutes without breaking concentration


